





From September 2019, students in Y7 – Y10 will read every morning. The books have been chosen by staff from across the school and reflect our dynamic and culturally rich school.

Term	Book title	Book cover	What's it about?
<b>Term 1</b>	<b>The Graveyard Book by Neil Gaiman</b>		<p>When a baby escapes a murderer intent on killing the entire family, who would have thought it would find safety and security in the local graveyard?</p> <p>Brought up by the resident ghosts, ghouls and spectres, Bod has an eccentric childhood learning about life from the dead. But for Bod there is also the danger of the murderer still looking for him - after all, he is the last remaining member of the family.</p>
<b>Term 2</b>	<b>Peter Pan by JM Barrie</b>		<p>Peter Pan (also known as the Boy Who Wouldn't Grow Up or Peter and Wendy) is the story of a mischievous little boy who can fly, and his adventures on the island of Neverland with Wendy Darling and her brothers, the fairy Tinker Bell, the Lost Boys, the Indian princess Tiger Lily, and the pirate Captain Hook.</p>
<b>Term 3</b>	<b>Stone Cold by Robert Swindells</b>		<p>Homeless on the streets of London, 16 year old Link feels he has become an invisible outcast. When he meets streetwise Ginger, life becomes more bearable and he learns the tricks of survival. But when Ginger goes missing, Link feels a sickening sense of foreboding...</p>
<b>Additional reader</b>	<b>Alice in Wonderland by Lewis Carroll</b>		<p>Alice in Wonderland Summary. Alice is sitting with her sister outdoors when she spies a White Rabbit with a pocket watch. Fascinated by the sight, she follows the rabbit down the hole. ... Left alone, she goes on through the wood and runs into the White Rabbit.</p>
